Contributing to Our Community

Ongoing Commitment

Class Parents

Class Parents are responsible for effectively disseminating important information to the parents in their class. Throughout the year, they help coordinate volunteers for school-wide events and are active volunteers themselves. Class Parents assist in arranging class trips and other classroom activities, and organize evening social events for the parents of their homerooms. They help create a welcoming environment for families new to VCS. Class Parents also occasionally serve as a focus group for the administration.

At the beginning of the year, the Vice-Chair of the VCS Board of Trustees solicits two parent volunteers from each homeroom to serve as Class Parents for the entire year. Class Parents' responsibilities are varied and important. Parents should volunteer for the position only if they are able to fully meet these responsibilities.

Class Parent meetings are held monthly and are led by the Vice-Chair. Class Parents may alternate attendance at these meetings, but should report to each other the business conducted and share the necessary work. Serving as a Class Parent is an excellent opportunity to help the school while learning more about it.

Community Service Committee

The Community Service Committee is comprised of parent volunteers and generally meets on a monthly basis. As a volunteer committee, projects may change, but the goal is to support school-wide projects as needed and share resource information to facilitate family volunteering outside of school. The Committee is also pivotal in helping to organize and implement VCS Service Day in May. New participants are encouraged and welcome.
